

Minneapolis Deanery Report

Beyond the information given in the parish reports, the following are noteworthy:


St Nicholas parish in Chisholm, MN has been *de facto* closed for several years, but not *de jure*. Although a petition to close St Nicholas and to hand all assets over to the Diocese was submitted to the Diocesan bishop several years ago (2009 or so), that petition has not been acted on by the bishop because the members of St Nicholas parish did not wish to see the Church become a building used for secular purposes. In this state of ecclesiastical limbo, the Diocesan Bishop and District Dean have been discussing options with former members of St Nicholas. With their consent, the Diocese has retained the services of Morbey and Olsen Law Firm to form them into a 501(c)3 tax exempt organization. That process will be completed within the next year. At that time, the Diocese will hand the church building over to the newly formed tax exempt organization, with the stipulation that the building be used only for ecclesial purposes subject to the consent of the Diocesan Bishop and retaining the right of first refusal. By this arrangement, the Diocese is released from all legal liabilities, and St Nicholas is protected from secular use.

On other fronts in the Minneapolis Deanery, Holy Myrrhbearers in St Cloud was reconstituted last year as a chapel, attached to the altar of St Herman's in South Minneapolis. Christ the Savior mission in Anoka, MN, was closed by His Grace Bp Alexander in December. St Andrew's Chapel in Minocqua, WI was closed in June. Holy Cross mission in Chisago City, MN has petitioned to be closed as of November 1, 2014.

The need for Deanery sponsored activities in the Minneapolis deanery is significantly mitigated by a very active inter-jurisdictional Orthodox clergy association, the Minnesota Eastern Orthodox Christian Clergy Association. The purpose of MEOCCA is to manifest the unity of the Orthodox Church that transcends the current "uncanonical" division of Orthodoxy in America. Under the umbrella of MEOCCA, the summer camp program for the youth, run by clergy and laity representing all the jurisdictions in the Twin Cities area, is one of the largest in the country. A Fall and Spring catechism class, taught each week by a different priest (or deacon) from the different "MEOCCA" parishes, has been very popular and well attended since its inception 15 years ago or so. These activities and ministries, as well as others, such as MEOCCA endorsed FOCUS MN, lectures and retreats endorsed or sponsored by MEOCCA throughout the year, and Lenten Sunday Vespers served each Sunday at a different "MEOCCA" parish, have produced in the Twin Cities area a strong 'koinonia' and the sense of functioning as one jurisdiction.

Keeping the Parish alive in this remote area of the country. There are Orthodox People in this area, due to the oil boom, and some come to Church once in a while, but none stay for long. A number of Russians and Serbs live in and around Minot and Bismarck, and come to Church too, but rarely. Some of them stay away, because the Services are in English and they don't like the new calendar. Upon request I serve "moleben" or "pannihida" for them, in Slavonic for the Russians and Serbian for the Serbs. I speak Russian and Serbian and they love socializing with me, but I can't make them come to Church regularly, which is very frustrating because we are such a small Parish and NEED people.	
Major Challenges Overcome	
In June the Parish bought a parsonage for the priest, who stayed for 2 ½ years in a FEMA trailer. We have recovered from the flood, but our savings are gone and we depend on our fundraisers and donations. The Church has been fully restored and looks nicer then before the flood. Four Icons by Fr. Theodore Jurewicz have been mounted on our Ikonostas.
