Highlights of Top Three Activities

- The Bible as Literature Podcast, a weekly internet program of the Ephesus School, reached 300,000 total downloads in 2014 and will publish its 100th episode this year.
- Bishop Paul's visit to St. Elizabeth and the preparation and community activities leading up to that weekend. It was the first time our parish hosted a diocesan bishop for a full weekend of services and activities.
- In tackling the challenges of mission life, this year, our community has embarked on a journey to improve our ability to work together at the expense of personal preferences in order to to attain our true goal, participation in God's Kingdom. Outreach and Charitable Activities

- Support of the Mendota Mdewakanton Dakota tribe annual Wacipi (PowWow). Among local Native American tribes, the Mdewakanton are the most disenfranchised; our community has been blessed to build a friendship with them. This year, we again raised \$1000 of assistance for the tribe. We also give them monthly financial support.
- In addition to maintaining a small food shelf in Eagan, St. Elizabeth parishioners continue to be extremely active in Focus Minnesota.
- Monthly financial support of the Minneapolis Peace House, a community of Catholic nuns and 30-40 volunteers from the Twin Cities metropolitan area who commit to the service of the poor and homeless.

Major Challenges Faced

• This year, our parish has had to adjust its plans to procure a permanent church building, due largely to unforeseen construction costs. As an interim step, we are looking to purchase (not lease) worship space. The chapel we have constructed in our current space can be easily adapted to another location. We are looking at multi-use buildings for sale in Eagan, MN and surrounding communities.
