MEETINGS

The Deanery has regular meetings in September, November, January or February, and June, as well as one meeting in conjunction with a Sunday Vespers in Lent. LENTEN VESPERS

Parishes from the Chicago, Milwaukee, and NE Indiana areas take turns hosting Sunday Vespers in Great Lent, with talks or homilies at each. This year the homilies followed Gospel lessons of the early days of Holy Week. Hosting parishes this year were: Archangel Michael, Burbank; Christ the Savior, Chicago;

Holy Resurrection, Palatine; Holy Theophany Chapel, William's Bay; and Holy Trinity Cathedral (Palm Sunday Bridegroom Matins).

YOUTH CAMPS

Winter camp (2/13-15) and summer camp (7/6-10) took place at Edwards YMCA Camp in East Troy, Wisconsin – an excellent facility which we have used for about ten years. Highlights of Top Three Activities

- 1. Bishop Paul made a visitation and celebrated the first Presanctified Liturgy of Great Lent. Fr. Gregory was awarded the nabedrennik and kamilavka.
- 2. Annual Paschal BBQ. This event began four years ago and is looked forward to as a way to break the Fast. Father Gregory supplies the meat and mans the grill, with everyone else bringing sides and desserts. An egg hunt also takes place for the younger children.
- 3. Hot Dog and Ice Cream Social Held Annually after the Dormition Fast (8/21 this year), we had a wonderful turnout from the neighboring parishes.

Outreach and Charitable Activities

- 1. Donations are regularly made to the local food pantry.
- 2. Grocery cards are on hand to give to those looking for help buying food.
- 3. Fr. Gregory attempts to be visible in the community whenever possible.

Major Challenges Faced

- 1. With 3 OCA churches, as well as 5 other canonical Orthodox Churches (3 GOA, 1 AOCA, 1 UOC), in the immediate vicinity, the mission field is somewhat saturated. This is exacerbated by the continued exploration of mission planting in the area.
- 2. Visitors come but rarely return in spite of the fact that this is the most welcoming parish I have ever been affiliated with, Orthodox or otherwise. Any feedback given has been positive, so there is no clear reason for this trend.
- 3. An aging parish population. While experience and institutional memory can be a blessing, it can also prove a hindrance when thoughts drift to "what was". There is a desire to do more, but a feeling of helplessness when imagining the energy necessary.

Neighborhood Block Party hosted by parish (7/20) & Liturgy/Picnic in the Park (8/28)

Creation of a Prayer Garden near our church entrance, providing a beautifully landscaped and sheltering place for prayer, resting, or quiet conversations in our urban neighborhood. This includes an icon kiosk with a box for prayer intentions which we take to the services inside. This was funded by a Parish Health Grant. The work was done by parishioners and neighbors.

Holy Theophany Chapel, William's Bay, WI.:

Visit by Bishop Paul for nameday Liturgy on Jn. 8th: Blessing of Water in chapel, and then Blessing of the Waters of Geneva Lake, followed by free brunch & swimming (indoors). 100 people attend this event annually.

Hosting of Chicago Deanery Lenten Vespers service on Sunday, April 17th.

Hosting Liturgy and feeding Chicago Deanery Youth Camp participants afterwards, on Sundays, 2/14 and 7/10. These are annual events,.

St Herman Chapel, West bend, WI:

Grew by 7 members this year -1 baptism, 2 chrismations.

Initiating a study group this fall.

Outreach and Charitable Activities

Frequent charitable appeals at the rectory door – funded from Gina Mueller Fund.

Provision and serving of hot meal monthly at women's and children's shelter downtown.

Provision and upkeep of much-used and needed kids' playground beside church for neighborhood and parish children.

Annual free neighborhood block party hosted and provided by parish – food, music, games, tours. This year featured Latin drumming circle.

Assistance to teachers working in inner city public schools; advocacy for public elementary, secondary, and college education and decent funding levels.

Participation in MICAH, a local interfaith social and economic justice group.

OCF chaplaincies (see above).

Prayer Garden (see above).

Initiation of a neighborhood development organization, Layton Park South, meeting monthly in our hall. Issues are neighborhood safety, cleanliness, and unity in this diverse multi-cultural and multi-racial neighborhood.

Commitment to Roots Ethiopia sending famine relief directly to families.

Participation in Clergy Syndesmos group's effort to assist local refugee resettlement agency and to help provide for one or two Syrian refugee families, when the State Dept. has finished its exhaustive 1-2 year vetting of these refugees.

Participation annual Pan-Orthodox Youth Day in the spring and in Chicago Deanery Youth Camps.

Major Challenges Faced

Urban membership, including many immigrant families – modest financial resources. We are improving in stewardship and financial planning.

Participation in festal services and in the practice of Confession, given the diversity of Orthodox backgrounds from which our members come. This requires slow, patient, and steady work.
