

Minneapolis Deanery Report
September 15, 2017

1. The St Nicholas Preservation Society was formed to preserve St Nicholas Orthodox Church in Chisholm, MN, closed officially in 2015 (or so), from being delivered over to buyers who might turn it into an office or apartment building, and to preserve it as a church, used only for ecclesiastical purposes. Before the Diocese of the Midwest could hand the property over to the St Nicholas Preservation Society Disbursement, however, the SNPS had to be formed into a 501C3 organization. This took more than a year. That process was completed in March and the property handed over by His Grace to the SNPS.
2. Holy Cross Mission in Chisago City, MN, was closed in 2013. The remaining funds in the Holy Cross treasury were given over to the Diocese of the Midwest and were earmarked by His Grace for disbursement to the mission parishes of the Minneapolis Deanery. After several meetings with the clergy of the Minneapolis Deanery, consensus was reached and in late Spring, early Summer of 2017, His Grace distributed the \$100k equally (minus expenses already paid out to different missions for clergy medical costs and moving costs) among the five missions of the Minneapolis Deanery:
 - St Nicholas in Pella, IA
 - Three Hierarchs in Northfield, MN
 - St Elizabeth in West St Paul, MN
 - Holy Myrrhbearers in St Cloud, MN
 - Holy Resurrection in Fargo, ND
3. For the first time in my tenure as Dean (going back to 2007 or so), all parishes in the Minneapolis Deanery are now served by their own rectors or priests-in-charge.
 - a. Fr Herman Klarr and his family were assigned to serve Holy Assumption in Lublin, WI. Fr Hermann also serves St John the Baptist one Sunday a month in nearby Stanley, WI; and St Mary's in Cornucopia, WI every fifth Sunday of the month during the summer.
 - b. Fr William Rettig and his wife, Jillian, were assigned to serve Holy Resurrection in Fargo, ND. This has proved to be a fruitful venture for the Rettigs. Not long after their assignment, Jillian gave birth to a daughter who should prove in future years not far distant to be the oldest of a large Rettig family.
 - c. Fr Stacey Richter and his family were assigned to St Peter the Aleut in Minot, ND. They are now a good 18 hours closer to their children's grandparents, who live in nearby Canada, as in north of the border.


And, that's the news from Lake Wobegon.



<p>With the blessing of Bishop Paul, we purchased a new church building on St. Paul’s West Side in February 2017. Renovation of the sanctuary and nave was complete by mid-March. This was a whirlwind project for our parish, but excellent for community building. We were able to host Lenten Vespers for the Minnesota Eastern Orthodox Clergy Association in March, and also blessed to celebrate Holy Week and Pascha in our new home. Bishop Neophitos of Nyeri and Mount Kenya was our guest speaker at the MEOCCA event.</p>	
Outreach and Charitable Activities	

- All donations from MEOCCA Lenten Vespers were given to Bishop Neophitos in support of his community.
- Support of the Mendota Mdewakanton Dakota tribe annual Wacipi (PowWow). Among local Native American tribes, the Mdewakanton are the most disenfranchised; our community has been blessed to build a friendship with them. This year, we again raised \$1000 of assistance for the tribe. We also give them monthly financial support.
- In addition to maintaining a small food shelf in St. Paul in support of the local Neighborhood House, St. Elizabeth parishioners are highly active in FOCUS Minnesota.
- Monthly financial support of the Minneapolis Peace House, a community of Catholic nuns and 30-40 volunteers from the Twin Cities metropolitan area who commit to the service of the poor and homeless.

Major Challenges Faced

- In order to keep costs as low as possible, we have had to invest significant time and energy to leverage volunteer labor for our building renovation. The results are fantastic and the project has moved very quickly, but the process has been a healthy challenge. All in all, the community has found new energy.
- One of the ways that we have managed the impact of our change in location (and the increased workload) has been through our small group ministry. We launched a pilot program in January, captured our learnings in June, and have just reorganized with new group leaders and a renewed focus on community service. The program has been very positive, but we continue to learn and improve how we relate to each other as a parish family.
