7 • WHAT JESUS SAYS ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT

One of the most widely known prayers of the Orthodox Christian Tradition is the Prayer to the Holy Spirit – "O Heavenly King, the Comforter, the Spirit of Truth, Who art everywhere present and fillest all things; Treasury of blessings and Giver of Life: Come and abide in us, and cleanse us from every impurity, and save our souls, O Good One!"

The Holy Spirit

- is God, the third person of the Holy Trinity, personally distinct from the Father and the Holy Spirit but sharing fully in the same divine nature.
- proceeds from the Father.
- is **sent into the world** by Jesus Christ.
- inspires God's People to speak God's Truth and to do His will: and
- is the **Giver of Life**, Who upholds and sustains creation in its existence, life, and growth.



Most of what Jesus says about the Holy Spirit is found in the Gospel of Saint John.

The **Holy Spirit** is the **Comforter**, the **Spirit of Truth**. The Holy Spirit came into the world fifty days after Christ's resurrection, on the day of Pentecost. We receive the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of **Chrismation**, thereby completing, confirming, and perfecting the new life we receive in the sacrament of **Baptism**.
